This year, with all the turmoil going on in the world, I am reminded of the beginnings of the NEFFA Festival. It began in 1944 in Massachusetts with a governorsponsored conference of recreation leaders throughout the state to talk about, and stimulate interest in, recreation programs that would, among other things, "be a vital factor in promoting peace." Mary Gillette, one of the founders of the Festival "sparked the idea of a Festival where people could learn and share the songs, dances and crafts of the various ethnic groups that have contributed to New England's rich heritage." The purposes of NEFFA to preserve folk traditions in New England and elsewhere, to encourage the development of a living folk culture, and to set and to encourage the attainment of high standards of quality and performance in the folk arts, arose from that beginning and continue today. As the early Festivals provided a way to bring people together in difficult times to share the folk cultures in New England and throughout the world, this Festival affords us the same opportunity. I hope you will enjoy the richness of experiences that the Festival offers.

If you have been to the Festival before, we're glad you're back! This is a great chance to encounter new things. If you are new to the Festival, welcome! You will discover a wide range of activities and experiences. The grid indicates which programs are for beginners or families. You can find a participatory dance to join at your experience level, enjoy concerts, storytelling or dance performances, or join singing, jamming or discussion sessions. The Program Committee has planned a wonderful program, with offerings to entice everyone, young and old. You can also take in crafts demonstrations, browse or shop in the Crafts Room or Folk Bazaar, or join your child at a project in the Activity Room. There's a lot to do – remember to pace yourself! Don't forget to relax with a tasty meal from the international offerings in the cafeteria, and enjoy conversations with friends old and new.

Each year the Festival springs up, almost by magic. This awe-inspiring transformation from an ordinary high school into a lively folk festival is the product of effort by many volunteers. All the performers at the Festival donate their services. Dedicated volunteers spend virtually the entire year planning the Festival, trying to find ways to add improvements. Hundreds of people you see (and many you don't) donate their time and energy to make the Festival as wonderful an event as possible. EVENT CODES

TYPE OF EVENT

[E] Entertainment

Concerts, performances, and other events in which watching or listening is the primary focus.

[P] Presentations

Events which focus on demonstrating a particular skill, or presenting educational material (as in a lecture or demonstration).

[G] Group participation

As determined by the event leader. this applies in particular to *non-dance* events, such as participatory singing, jam sessions, discussions, and many family events.

[T] Teaching featured

Events in which teaching a particular skill is the primary focus (i.e., "how-to" workshops).

[D] Participatory dancing

Dance events in which walk-throughs and prompting are provided by a leader.

[N] No teaching provided

Participatory dance events in which no instruction or walk-throughs are provided.

[C] Chat/Discussion

Events in which the audience joins the presenter in discussing a topic of mutual interest.

LEVEL OF EVENT

(intended level of experience or ability, especially for participatory dance and teaching events)

[F] Family Event

Participatory events especially geared to families and others who enjoy being with children.

[B] Beginner Level

No experience assumed.

[M] Mixed Level

Some experience, or a variety of experience levels assumed.

[X] Experienced Level

Much experience assumed.

THE COST OF THE NEW ENGLAND FOLK FESTIVAL

You have probably heard that "NEFFA is a volunteer organization". The Festival could not happen without the hours of dedication of many, many volunteers – including the Board that works on planning the festival 10 months a year, all the musicians and performers, and the folks who do all sorts of jobs at the festival including help in the parking lots and cleaning the tables in the Cafeteria.

But producing the Festival is not free! In 2002 the total cost of the Festival was over \$74,000. Here are just some of the major costs incurred for last years Festival:

• School-related Costs 22,728
• Shuttle Buses
• Police and EMTs 4,602
• Sound
(equipment & contractors)
• Renting Equipment 9,532
(porta-potties, stages, chairs, etc.)
• Piano Rentals 2,470
• Electrician
• Program Materials 5,630

(booklets, grids, etc.)

Other costs include things like materials for the Activities Room, tickets and membership forms, signs (inside and out), materials for committees that organize volunteers, housing, crafts, and the folk bazaar, publicity, and even trash pickup.

The NEFFA board continually strives to keep the ticket prices for the Festival as low as possible while still bringing in enough income to cover the costs.
