

LETTER

FROM THE PRESIDENT

Welcome to the 61st annual New England Folk Festival. Thank you for coming to enjoy all the activities that attract you from our offerings of vocal and instrumental music, performance and participatory dance, admiring and purchasing crafts and folk products, as well eating and socializing in the cafeteria.

There are two kinds of support that are essential for our Festival to continue to thrive, membership and new leadership. Please consider becoming a member of NEFFA. Entry fees may not cover all our expenses, and we don't wish to raise prices much, as that would exclude some people from coming. For \$20 per individual, or \$38 per family, you would get our newsletter, discounts on admission, and most of all, the satisfaction of supporting an organization that is dedicated to promoting the traditions that you love. NEFFA has a strong group of experienced leaders, but some of us have to move on as we go through different stages of life. We need new volunteers to join us in the pleasures and challenges of building a strong organization to keep this festival and our dances going, help to preserve and promote our folk legacy, and encourage the "new traditions" being created in our own time.

If you are new to the Festival, you are especially welcome. The grid indicates which programs are for beginners or families. You can find a participatory dance to join at your experience level, enjoy concerts, storytelling or dance performances, or join singing, jamming or discussion sessions. You can also visit the Crafts Room, Folk Bazaar and Cafeteria. The essence of the "Folk Tradition" that we

are a part of is that most of our programs are for the whole community of folks who come. While each event is not for everyone, there are dozens of activities that will suit anyone interested in folk traditions.

The bad news is that we have had an important loss of space at this Festival. The high school has redefined the use of the large Lower Hall that we have loved as a dance space. It is no longer available to us, so our Program Committee have worked with this unfortunate situation and scheduled the space using what we used to call the "overflow hall" for the dances they expect will draw smaller crowds than the dances scheduled concurrently in the upstairs Main Hall. We on the Board are as upset and dismayed as we expect the dancers will be, but we intend to have a great Festival anyway. We are committed to finding a more suitable Festival site as soon as we can, and would be very grateful for help in this process.

Our performers, organizers, artists and staff are all volunteers. This magical weekend happens because of the dedication of well over a thousand committed workers. Once again, if you would like to join the volunteers in the year-long preparation for the Festival, or to work during it, please provide your name and contact information on an evaluation form and we will be in touch. There is a delightful sense of accomplishment at being part of a real-life "Brigadoon," transforming an ordinary high school to a buzzing, joyous folk festival for one magical weekend.

EVENT CODES

TYPE OF EVENT

[E] Entertainment

Concerts, performances, and other events in which watching or listening is the primary focus.

[P] Presentations

Events which focus on demonstrating a particular skill, or presenting educational material (as in a lecture or demonstration).

[G] Group participation

As determined by the event leader. this applies in particular to *non-dance* events, such as participatory singing, jam sessions, discussions, and many family events.

[T] Teaching featured

Events in which teaching a particular skill is the primary focus (i.e., "how-to" workshops).

[D] Participatory dancing

Dance events in which walk-throughs and prompting are provided by a leader.

[N] No teaching provided

Participatory dance events in which no instruction or walk-throughs are provided.

[C] Chat/Discussion

Events in which the audience joins the presenter in discussing a topic of mutual interest.

LEVEL OF EVENT

(intended level of experience or ability, especially for participatory dance and teaching events)

[F] Family Event

Participatory events especially geared to families and others who enjoy being with children.

[B] Beginner Level

No experience assumed.

[M] Mixed Level

Some experience, or a variety of experience levels assumed.

[X] Experienced Level

Much experience assumed.

FESTIVAL NOTES

Please wear only clean, non-marking shoes which have not been worn outside (such as clean sneakers or soft-soled dance shoes) in the Main Hall, Lower Hall and Auditorium Stage.

There is no on-street parking associated with the Festival -- avoid frustration by parking at the **TJX parking lot** off Rt. 30 in Natick. Shuttle buses run regularly between all the satellite parking lots and the high school throughout the weekend. See maps for parking locations.

Park at your own risk. The New England Folk Festival Association, its agents, servants and employees do not assume any liability for any damage, theft or other loss to your vehicle or your property that occurs as a result of parking your vehicle in any of the lots that are designated for Festival use. Neither overnight parking nor camping is permitted on school grounds or in any of the lots used for Festival Parking. Observe the designated NEFFA parking signs.

NEFFA will not be making announcements about towing.

Access Guides for attendees with disabilities are available in the Lobby and at the Hospitality Table. The Guides include wheelchair accessibility information, and information about ASL and ALD services, etc. **Large print grids** are available in the Lobby and at the Hospitality Table. Please contact Hospitality if you need assistance with access to a program or activity.

Children must be supervised by a parent or guardian **at all times.** Events coded **F** are designed for you and your

children to participate in together. However, any Festival Committee member who finds a small child alone will bring him/her to the Hospitality Table to await his/her parent. Parents may report small children who are missing to the Hospitality Table. The New England Folk Festival Association, its agents, servants and employees do not assume any liability for any injuries to a child sustained as a result of parent or guardian's failure to adequately supervise a child at the Festival.

Questions? Can't find the Auditorium Stage? Lost your ticket? Need a ride? Want to leave a message for a friend? Ask for help at the **Hospitality Table**, or stop one of the Festival Committee members who are wearing special "**ASK ME**" badges. Probably no one person can answer all your questions, but we'll help you find the right place to ask.
