



FESTIVAL NOTES

On the dance floors, please wear only clean, non-marking shoes that have not been worn outside (such as clean sneakers or soft-soled dance shoes).

There is no on-street parking associated with the Festival. Please park only in marked spaces in the Hotel or Trade Center lots.

Park at your own risk. The New England Folk Festival Association (NEFFA), its directors, officers, agents, volunteers, and employees do not assume any liability for any damage, theft or other loss to your vehicle or your property that occurs as a result of parking your vehicle in any of the lots that are designated for Festival use. Observe the designated NEFFA parking signs. NEFFA will not be making announcements about towing.

For the 2025 NEFFA Festival, **vaccination and masking are optional.** Please respect everyone's personal choice to mask or not mask. By attending the NEFFA Festival, you are assuming all risk related to exposure to and illness from infectious diseases including but not limited to COVID-19. Attendance is at your own risk.

This year, we are printing only **large-print grids**, which are available at the Information Tables in the Trade Center and in the Hotel. Please contact Information if you need assistance with access to a program or activity.

Children must be supervised by a parent or guardian at all times. Events coded F are designed for you and your children to participate in together. We encourage you to put contact information on the back of your children's name badges. Any Festival Committee member who finds a small child alone will bring them to the Information Table to await their parent. NEFFA, its directors, officers, agents, volunteers, and employees do not assume any

liability for any injuries to a child sustained as a result of parent or guardian's failure to adequately supervise a child at the Festival.

Questions? Can't find the Morris dancers? Lost your ticket? Need a ride? Want to leave a message for a friend? Ask for help at the Information Table, and we'll do our best to assist you.

NEFFA encourages all dancers to exercise care in their dancing. NEFFA, its directors, officers, agents, volunteers, and employees do not assume any liability for any injuries that may be sustained due to the condition of the halls or to dancing.

NEFFA maintains a **Lost & Found at the Information Table.** Before you leave the Festival, check at the Information Table to report belongings you have mislaid. The item may already be there. If not, and it is found at the close of the Festival, it will be mailed to you, if we have your name and address. If you discover after you leave the Festival that you have lost something, you may email lostandfound@neffa.org to see if the item was found, or visit the Lost & Found page at the NEFFA website to report your missing item. Items not claimed by July 1 will be donated to charity, if appropriate.

Please watch your personal belongings. NEFFA, its directors, officers, agents, volunteers, and employees do not assume any liability for any damage, theft or loss to your personal property that occurs as a result of attendance at the Festival.

NEFFA does not permit Festival-goers to bring dogs or other animals into program areas during the Festival, except service animals which are present for the purpose of assisting someone with a disability.

This is an all-volunteer Festival, so be understanding if the program gets off schedule or someone goofs. We invite your patience and hope you will join the fun and friendliness.

Please politely oblige if one of our safety volunteers asks you to move out of a jammed doorway.

Photographs taken by designated NEFFA photographers may be used as promotional material on our website and in other media. Attendance at the Festival will be considered consent to have photographs taken.

Privacy Statement Our promise to you is that any contact information that we gather from you – performers, volunteers, vendors, members, attendees, etc. is gathered solely for use by NEFFA and will not be shared or sold.

Festival craftspeople, merchants, and those who serve food come at their own expense to share their interests with others. Do consider buying items that are for sale, but remember that the transactions are entirely between you and the vendors.



Please adhere to the Royal Plaza's **site policies** and procedures:

- Smoking is not allowed.
- Smoking, ingesting or otherwise using or consuming cannabis products is not allowed.
- Room capacities must be respected.
- Please do not bring food into program areas.



ROOM CAPACITY

We hope we will have few situations where the number of people wishing to attend an event exceeds the capacity of the space where it is scheduled, but we cannot allow overcrowding in rooms. The capacity of each room is posted outside of each room, and it's possible that a Safety volunteer will need to restrict entrance to a crowded room.

If you are not allowed into an event because the room capacity has been reached, please be understanding and cooperate with our Safety volunteers and NEFFA organizers.

CODE OF CONDUCT

ABOUT NEFFA

We are a diverse community of friendly people who enjoy and promote many folk traditions, including folk dancing and singing. We aim to create inclusive, safe, and welcoming events with your help. Please refer to our Code of Conduct (below) for more information.

NEFFA events run on volunteer energy! Thank you for welcoming new folks, volunteering, and participating in our events. We really appreciate your help!

HOW TO ENJOY DANCE SESSIONS SAFELY

- Please feel free to join in participatory dance sessions.
- If it's a partner dance, you may ask anyone to dance or anyone may ask you. Either of you can accept or politely refuse. Dancing with different people is a valued tradition, and we encourage you to change partners frequently.
- If you are new, ask experienced dancers to dance with you.
- If you are an experienced dancer, ask someone new or sitting out. You can also help newer dancers with friendly gestures (verbal instructions can be confusing).
- For dances with two roles, when you ask someone to dance, ask if they have a preference. It's okay to switch roles!
- If it's a line dance, ask to break in between people or join at the end of the line. If a dance seems more complicated, try the dance behind the line. Watch the line leader or an experienced dancer to get the steps.
- When turning, eye contact helps avoid dizziness. If it's uncomfortable for you, look at your partner's shoulder, ear or forehead.
- Take care of yourself, and get consent for flourishes or for more energetic dancing. If you have an injury, tell people verbally, or by wearing a brace, bandana, or badge. Here are some examples of things to check in about with your partner:
 - "Do you like to twirl?"
 - "Do you like to swing fast?"
 - "I'm dizzy. Can we slow down?"
 - "My shoulder/wrist/hand hurts. Can we find an easier way to swing/allemande?"
- Laugh off mistakes, and be patient with yourself and others.

HOW TO ENJOY FOLK MUSIC AND SONG SESSIONS

- NEFFA encourages a culture of participation as well as performance. Sometimes it can be tricky to see where those lines get drawn, so here are some helpful tips.
- At the Festival, the program has codes that can help you know what to expect and how to participate.
 - Sessions with an E code are Entertainment and you are invited to be a respectful audience. If the performer invites you to sing or play along, by all means do so!
 - If a session has a G code, it means Group Participation is welcome. You can expect to bring an instrument, sing along on the chorus, or lead a song at the leader's invitation.
- The leader for a jam session or singalong is responsible for promoting respectful participation. Keep an eye on the leader for guidance.
- Take turns. Make sure everyone has a chance before you lead a second song or tune.
- Listening is as important as singing or playing. Please keep your attention on the session and move side conversations out of the program space.
- If you're leading a song, help to create a welcoming environment. As you are able, we encourage you to avoid or adapt offensive lyrics such as racist or sexist references. Consider the impact of your lyrics on others.

CODE OF CONDUCT

We expect all of our attendees – performers, volunteers, and participants – to respect our **culture of consent**. We all share the responsibility for a satisfying, safe, and successful event. All interactions in NEFFA spaces should be consensual. Please treat everyone with kindness and respect. Be considerate of the physical needs, skill level, and energy of your fellow attendees. We expect everyone to remember and respect that “no” means “no.”

We are an **inclusive** event. Think carefully before commenting on a dancer’s appearance, ethnic heritage, or any other potentially sensitive topic. If another person’s behavior makes you feel uncomfortable or unsafe, please report it to us so we can address the situation.

Parents/guardians are ultimately responsible for the safety and conduct of their children. Young children should be supervised by a parent or another designated adult at all times.

All attendees under the age of 18 are encouraged to provide emergency contact information on the back of their Name Tag badges.

Many of our participants are **sensitive to fragrances**. Please do your best to avoid scented products.

How do I report a concern?

Please share issues or concerns, particularly regarding unsafe behavior, so we can continue to produce welcoming events.

- **At the Festival:** The Safety Table can write down a report to be addressed after the Festival. For more urgent concerns, ask anyone wearing a Festival Committee badge, or a person at the Safety or Information Tables, to refer you to a member of our Incident Response Team.
- **At non-Festival NEFFA events:** If you cannot identify who to talk to, ask the people at the door who the event coordinator is.
- **At any time:** You can always contact members of the NEFFA Board of Directors using any of the methods on our website at <https://www.neffa.org/contacting-neffa-organizers/>.

What happens once I report a concern?

We take all reports seriously. Depending on the situation, we may take a variety of actions to respond to violations of our code of conduct, up to and including removing an individual from the Festival or other event.



1978: The Original Series is Born

Dancers in the Boston area are indebted to Tod Whittemore for founding a landmark dance series. Driven by Tod’s energy, charisma, and sense of fun infusing the dance, the series became quite popular.

1990: NEFFA Takes on the Dance!

When he decided to stop the dance, Tod had no plans for the future of the series, but it became evident that a small group of dancers wanted to keep the dance alive. In that group were Steve Boylan, Cal Howard, Larry Jennings, Leslie Morrison, Dan Pearl, John Rowen, and Ernie Spence. The committee saw benefit to running the dance under the auspices of a non-profit organization, NEFFA. The Thursday Night Dance Committee (TNDC) was formed, with Dan Pearl as Chair, and NEFFA President Lisa Greenleaf as ex officio member.

August 2006: Thursdays move halls

The dance was moved to the Concord Scout House and has continued there till the present time.

TNDC Vision

The committee has strived to provide a fun New England-style dance that features high quality local and touring performers, as well as providing a venue for newer, talented individuals to get some exposure. The all-volunteer TNDC, now consisting of Dereck Kalish, Lisa Greenleaf, Terry Huffaker, and Sue Rosen takes an active hand in the conduct of the dance. We strive to offer a dance where all are welcome, and that everyone dances with everyone in all parts of the hall.

IN MEMORIAM

Dan Pearl (1955-2024)

From Queens, NY, Dan fell in love with contra dancing at the first dance he attended soon after moving to Massachusetts after college. He is remembered as a much-loved caller and dance leader with a calm, straightforward, and humorous demeanor that made beginning and experienced dancers alike feel very comfortable. A proud member and leader of several traditional folk organizations, Dan devoted 45 years to volunteering for NEFFA, wearing a multitude of hats including Arrangements, Outside Facilities, Operations, Lost and Found, Newsletter Editor, Website, and Program Committee web support. He served as a board member, vice president and secretary, the latter for many years. He was a regular NEFFA performer, calling contra dances and leading workshops on calling and dance administration, and a favorite "Gigs from Hell."




In 1990, Dan was central to continuing and transforming the Thursday Night Contra Dance in Cambridge, MA, to a NEFFA-sponsored dance with a dynamic format offering different callers and live bands every week, and which is now held at the Concord Scout House. In 2014, he was awarded a lifetime membership in NEFFA in recognition of his numerous and longstanding contributions to the organization and the community it supports.

The Covid epidemic and illnesses prevented Dan from attending dances in recent years as much as he would have liked, but he remained an active member of the NEFFA executive board (and its secretary) at the time of his death. He was thrilled to attend the April 2024 New England Folk Festival in person and spend time with many friends. Don't miss the "Thank You, Dan Pearl" event in tribute to him on Saturday night at this year's Festival!

Tony Parkes (1949-2024)

Born in New York City, Tony studied contra and square calling with several well-known callers, including Ralph Page. He began calling folk dances in 1964 and called dances in 35 states, Belgium, the Czech Republic, Denmark, Germany, England, and Canada. He co-founded the band Yankee Ingenuity and wrote more than 90 dances, with many published in the compilations Shadrack's Delight and Son of Shadrack.

According to the Bedford Citizen, "He taught at myriad folk-dance camps and events including Pinewoods Camp in Plymouth, MA, Stockton Folk Dance Camp in Stockton, CA, Ralph Page Legacy Weekend in New Hampshire, and The New England Folk Festival (which he attended and performed at every year from 1969 to 2023). Tony also deeply loved Gilbert and Sullivan operettas. He performed in all 13 of the extant shows in both leads and the chorus. His dance calling experience made him a crystal-clear singer of Gilbert and Sullivan's fast-paced patter songs. He was especially fond of the enigmatic Nightmare Song from Iolanthe."



Tony served on the boards of NEFFA and the Folk Arts Center of New England. We fondly remember how he called the "Merry Go Round", getting more frenzied with each repetition.

Evelyn Murray (1937-2025)

From a tribute written by Linda McJannet, "Evelyn was born in Nairobi, where her father was in the diplomatic service. Her family belonged to Clan Murray, and Evelyn's father and later Evelyn herself were active in Clan affairs. She graduated from Southampton University with a degree in physics and math, and, after further study at Tufts University and MIT, she embarked on a career in engineering, including a stint at MIT's Lincoln Laboratory in Lexington. In 1971, she joined the Society for Women Engineers and became a Fellow Life Member of the Society. Those familiar with her work described her as a "ground-breaking woman engineer."

"Later and until her return to the UK in 2014, Evelyn, with her husband Tom Lenthall, owned and operated the Atholl Brose, a Cambridge, Massachusetts, shop with Scottish goods, including dance items such as ghillies, hose, and brooches. She also worked with H&R Block, an accounting agency, and she was a skilled kilt-maker and kilt-repairer (as this writer can attest). In the mid-1970s, Evelyn founded NHSCOT, a nonprofit organization officially known as The New Hampshire Gathering of the Scottish Clans, Inc. That event led to the inaugural NH Highland Games in 1976 and then to the annual games at Loon Mountain Resort in the White Mountains of New Hampshire.

"In 1988, Evelyn co-founded the Strathspey and Reel Society of New Hampshire, which met monthly to learn, play, and perform Scottish music, especially fiddle music. The group recently changed its name to the New Hampshire Scottish Music Club, and it continues to live by its original motto: "Having fun with Scottish music." "


Evelyn was a member of the NEFFA Festival Dance Committee as early as 1966, led the RSCDS Scottish demonstration team in the 1970, and taught dancing in Boston and Maine for decades. We fondly remember how Evelyn brought her love of everything Scottish to NEFFA and shared it widely!

John Roberts (1944-2025)

In words from John's website, "I'm probably best known for my work with Tony Barrand, another ex-pat Brit who arrived at Cornell at the same time as I did. So we became the two lively Brits who sang folk songs, often wore funny hats, and went on to sing at folk festivals. With Tony, I became part of Nowell Sing We Clear, and over 40 years this 'different' Christmas show featuring pub carols, midwinter customs, a death-and-resurrection mummies' play, visiting customs and their songs, as well as the story of Jesus as seen through the lens of folksong, became something of a tradition among our loyal audiences in New England and beyond."

John performed often at NEFFA, leading song swaps, singing solo or with Tony Barrand, Pamela Goddard, or Ye Mariners All. He has left us a rich legacy of songs, tunes, and friendship. "We are ten times less by one." Let's sing for John and share the songs he gave us.
